VMix What Is It?

When you want to live stream, switch in between sources, play recorded media, have graphics, and be able to stream VMix is your solution. VMix is not a free option but they do give a 60 free trial. You will need a fast computer with plenty of horsepower to make things run smoothly. New computers may cost too much. You can find gently used computers that do work well.

The computer that I would suggest is Dell T3600 Workstation Xeon

Processor is generally an i5 8 core processor. You would want at least 32gb of ram, 1-2gb graphics card. A Solid State Drive would work well. You will still need a video capture card depending on your gear. Blackmagic and Magwell both make sdi or

hdmi capture cards.

Vmix becomes a small TV Station that would have taken a lot more gear to do even a few years ago. You can even have remote guests join into the broadcast with VMix Call. As long as there is an internet connection you can bring them in. VMix also supports NDI. NDI allows you to have other devices on the network (like a computer running ProPresenter/Mediashout) to bring the graphics in as an input. Everything on VMix is an input. Simply click the add input button.

VMix Acts like a switcher, but you can also use it in connection with a switcher. The software is priced right but it is a solid investment for reliable streaming.





VMix What Is It?
